Letter From the Pastor

Greetings and Praises to our King,

We have a lot to be thankful for:

The first American Thanksgiving was celebrated in 1621, to commemorate the harvest reaped by the Plymouth Colony after a harsh winter. In that year, Governor William Bradford proclaimed a day of thanksgiving. The Colonists celebrated it as a traditional English harvest feast, to which they invited the local Wampanoag Indians. By the mid-1800s, many states observed a Thanksgiving holiday. Meanwhile, the poet and editor Sarah J. Hale had begun lobbying for a national Thanksgiving proclamation, declaring the last Thursday in November a day of Thanksgiving. In 1939, 1940 and 1941, President Franklin D. Roosevelt, seeking to lengthen

the Christmas shopping season, proclaimed Thanksgiving to be celebrated on the third Thursday in November. Controversy followed, and Congress passed a joint resolution in

1941 that Thanksgiving should fall on the fourth Thursday of November, where it remains.

Thanksgiving Day is a national holiday, celebrated primarily in the United States and Canada as a day of giving thanks for the blessings of the harvest and of the preceding year. Prayers of thanks and special Thanksgiving ceremonies are common in almost all religions, after harvests and at other times. The **Thanksgiving holiday's his**tory in North America is rooted in English traditions dating from the Protestant Reformation.

We have a lot to be thankful for. As Paul says in 1 Thessalonians 5: 16-**18 "Be joy**ful always, pray at all times, be thankful in all circumstances. This is what God wants from you in your life, **in union with Christ Jesus."** This is not just holiday cliché, rather, this is what God says we should do and we are to do this at all times.

It's defined on the NYAC web

site as an annual meeting of a church where officers are elected for the coming year. It also receives reports, reviews and evaluates the total mission and ministry of the congregation, and adopts objectives and goals recommended by the administrative council, or the Administrative Board. It also recommends candidates for the ordained and diaconal ministry to the District Committee on Ordained Ministry or to the Conference Board of Diaconal Ministry. Members of the Administrative Council, or Board, are members of the Charge Conference. The district superintendent calls the meeting and presides over it. All in the church may attend the meeting.
