Lenten Centering Prayer

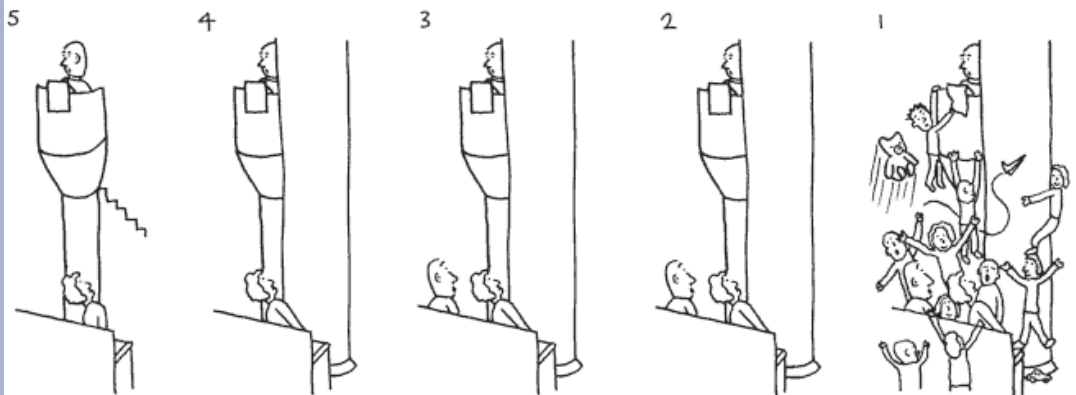
If you want to deepen your relationship with God come join us during the Lenten season for centering prayer. **Psalm 46:10 says: "Be still and know that I am God"**

I would like to introduce the expansion a reorganization of the Anchor House

Women’s Facility. We are a twenty eight bed OASAS (Office of Alcohol and Substance Abuse Services) licensed intensive residential treatment program.

As a full service treatment provider we offer a comprehensive array of services. Some of our services include Individual and Group Counseling, Trauma, Women’s Health, Family and Parenting, Anger Management, Relapse Prevention, Academic Tutoring and Vocation? Education Counseling. Some of the newer

service include and on-site Registered Nurse, Licensed Psychotherapist, Family Counseling and support groups.

In addition to our expansion OASAS has selected our program to act as a Recovery Care Management site under a federal grant through SAMAHA (Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration). This grant has allowed our facility to offer off-site recovery support services. Some of the grant serviced include Psychotherapy, Spiritual Guidance, Civic Restoration/Rap sheet, Optometry, Domestic

Violence and transportation assistance. Intake counselors are available 7 days a week.

Screening process is strictly confidential according to New York State Confidentiality laws.

We look forward to the opportunity to serve and coach women through their healing process and self-sufficiency.

Who We Are?

I wonder how many of you know that the Community United Methodist Church has **changed it’s name. Well... not really,** You see, one hundred years ago the United Methodist Church went by the name Methodist Episcopal Church and so it was when we were incorporated in 1920. As we all know nothing stays the same and over the years Methodism evolved and with mergers so

changed its name. We’ve actually gone by our present name of United Methodist Church since the 1968 merger of the United Evangelical Brethren Church and the then Methodist Church.

The presence of two statutes on the New York State law explaining these name changes is all we needed, for the last century, to be in compliance so we left

our certificate of incorporation **alone with it’s now outdated** name.

In the present age banks have gotten tighter in their rules for maintaining accounts and so early this year we had to amend our certificate of incorporation **to show our name... as we’ve all** known it these last 45 years.
