- ❖ The church group that raises the largest amount between now and July 31, 2014 will receive a personal visit from me at one of your worship services (with the support of your pastor) where I will present a

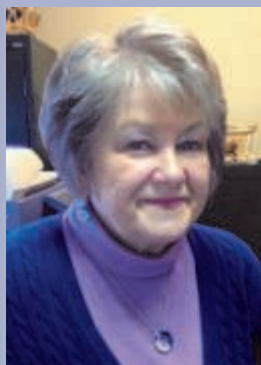
personal rap about what God is doing in our lives.

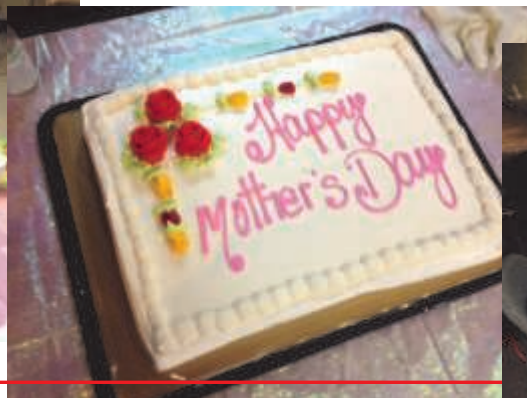
that role, I can be reached at 718.446.0690 Extension 104.

### Trustees News Corner

This spring the Trustees have and are still in the process of fixing Sanctuary building leaks. Here are some of the fixed items that have been accomplished.

Bell Tower: fixed leaking roof.

Roof valley-left side of Church on rear:  
Built up low part of valley to better slope valley and remove ponding.

South West corner of Church:  
Secure leader and leader head and rebuild roof corner.

North West corner of Church:  
New scupper box with leader and elbow and rebuild corner section of roof.

Right side of Tower:

Rebuild 100sq. ft of flat roof with flashing and membrane around perimeter.

Back side of Tower:  
Seal existing flashing and install 4 inch round leader to existing leader for extension purposes.

Library:  
Seal a 6 foot long crack above window.

All of this came at a cost of \$7500.00 but was much **needed for our Lord's** house.

We also had the Church office re-**carpeted, it's ceiling** repaired, new shelving unit built, walls and ceiling painted after having damage done from our old leaking roof that we replaced in 2013. We also had new carpeting put in the upper east room and a few mem-

bers of our Church volunteered to re-paint the **room's walls and ceiling.**

We will have many more projects coming which include fixing the area around library window as well as painting the room, painting damaged ceiling outside of upper east/tower room. Re-plaster the wall and paint in the Bell Tower room.

We will also have to fix the back wall of the sanctuary since it has water damage and will have to be fixed and sealed. We will also look into other areas which have been subject to water damage over the years.

Due to our increasing spring rains and harsh weather patterns we have to do all **that we can to keep God's** building protected.
